Guideline for Trellises

For our purposes: a Trellis is a frame supporting open latticework used for training vines and creeping plants. Lattice is an open framework made of strips of metal, wood, or the like interwoven to form regular, patterned spaces.

Pursuant to Article XIII, Sections 13 and 23 of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions, no fences, pens, or detached structures are permitted. However, Trellises may be incorporated into a landscaping design subject to the following restrictions:

- 1. No more than two (2) trellises per lot.
- Trellises can only be made of pressure treated wood, vinyl or metal. Wood or vinyl trellises must be painted to match the house paint. Metal trellises must be made from ornamental iron. It must be kept in good condition. Any rotting, rusting or otherwise unsightly trellis shall be immediately removed or replaced.
- 3. Trellises cannot be larger than three (3) foot wide by six (6) foot tall. The trellis must be level and properly secured to the ground or home.
- 4. If a free standing trellis is not providing support for a plant then it shall be immediately removed.

Compliance of Free Standing Trellises will be monitored by the Grounds Committee

Compliance of Attached Trellises will be monitored by the Architectural Review Committee (ARC)
